

Slaughter Applauds \$15 Million Federal Economic Development Grant for Rochester

District One of Few Chosen to Receive Funding from Competitive WIRED Grant Program

Washington, DC - On the occasion of Under Secretary of Labor Steve Law's visit to Rochester, Rep. Louise M. Slaughter (D-Fairport), Ranking Member of the House Rules Committee, today reiterated her support for a Department of Labor grant awarded to the Rochester area totaling \$15 million over three years. The funds will be used for economic development and job training. Rep. Slaughter authored a letter of support for the grant, which accompanied the region's application for it.

"Rochester is already home to national leaders in cutting-edge technology," Rep. Slaughter said. **"This funding will substantially aid in our efforts to grow our industries, and will enable innovators and entrepreneurs to create a new generation of local companies with a national impact,"** she added. **"And I know that with continued federal support, our workers will be ready to meet the challenges ahead."**

The funding comes as part of a Department of Labor initiative known as the Workforce Innovation in Regional Economic Development, or WIRED, program.

The WIRED funding will be used to back developing technologies, in addition to supporting high-tech job training and education in areas such as life sciences and optics, which are well established in Rochester. Other portions of the grant will be distributed to entrepreneurs, who need initial investments to grow their businesses.

Over 100 regions applied for the WIRED grant, with only 13 receiving it.

I am writing in support of New York's Finger Lakes Region's Workforce Innovation in Regional Economic Development (WIRED) Initiative grant application.

The Rochester-Finger Lakes region has long been a birthplace for innovation and routinely ranks among the top communities in patents issued per capita. In a recent survey this region ranked 5th in "Overall Innovation Capacity" based on our number of high tech employers and universities.
