Slaughter Responds to President's Veto of Water Resources Development Act

Washington, DC - Rep. Louise M. Slaughter (NY-28), Chairwoman of the House Rules Committee, today responded to President Bush's veto of the bi-partisan Water Resources Development Act (WRDA).

"The President's veto of WRDA is just another example of this Administration's misplaced priorities," said Rep. Slaughter. **"This bill passed through both the Senate and House and Senate with overwhelming bipartisan support and contains water-related projects that are vital to Western New York and the entire country."**

"The 28th Congressional District includes about a third of New York State's Lake Ontario Coastline, which is one of our most precious natural resources. □ Investments contained in WRDA are critical in my efforts to protect this resource and leverage it to help create jobs and spur economic development. I look forward to overriding the President's veto next week so we can ensure our local communities can move ahead with these important projects without delay," added Slaughter.

WRDA projects secured by Rep. Slaughter include:

- A study on Low-Head Hydroelectric power on the Niagara River
- Olcott Harbor breakwater project
- Niagara River watershed study to examine ecological issues
- A study on the Genesee River watershed

- Authorization allowing Rochester access to an account that funds capital improvements to the Erie Canal.
