**Rochester Leaders - Congresswoman Slaughter, County Executive Brooks, Mayor
Duffy, Superintendent Brizard - Celebrate the *Freedom Heroes Book***

Rochester, NY - Congresswoman Louise M. Slaughter, Chair of the House Committee on Rules, today joined County Executive Maggie Brooks, Mayor Robert Duffy, and Superintendent Jean-Claude Brizard in celebrating *Freedom Heroes*, a book about Susan B. Anthony and Frederick Douglass produced by students at the School of Imaging and Information Technology at Edison.

Today, Brooks, Duffy, and Brizard, along with officials from Monroe County elementary schools, students, and parents attended a press conference at Edison to announce that copies of the book will be distributed to Monroe County elementary schools for use by third and fourth graders. The office of Congresswoman Slaughter and the Freedom Heroes Committee organized today's event.

"The *Freedom Heroes* book is a tremendous accomplishment and I applaud all of the hardworking and enthusiastic students who were involved in the production," said Congresswoman Slaughter. **"**

BACKGROUND

Students at the School of Imaging & Information Technology at Edison researched, wrote, designed, illustrated, published, and coordinated the printing of the *Freedom Heroes* book. During the book's production, the students met with local third graders, their target audiences, and received advice from a local children's author.

The Freedom Heroes Committee will give multiple copies of the book to every elementary school in Monroe County this school year. The goal is to distribute at least one classroom set to each school library and six copies to every third and fourth grade teacher for use with reading groups.

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
