

Congresswoman Louise Slaughter (NY-28) announced that Lyndonville will be receiving over \$1.6 million in loans and grants from recovery funds to improve its wastewater systems.

“The Recovery Act continues to help rebuild America’s flagging infrastructure,” said Slaughter. “Ancient water systems in towns like Lyndonville are in a distressing state, and this project will both put people to work and improve the health and sanitation of the town for years to come.”

The Recovery Act (ARRA) funding is being administered by USDA Rural Development’s Water and Environmental Program which provides loans and grants to ensure that the necessary investments are made in water and wastewater infrastructure to deliver safe drinking water and protect the environment in rural areas. The Village of Lyndonville will receive a \$919,000 loan and a \$717,000 grant (ARRA) to be used for wastewater system improvements.

Since the passage of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act in February 2009, more than \$330 million in Recovery Act investments have been made in the 28th District. These essential funds have slowed the recession, filled crippling budget gaps in state and local governments that would have left teachers and police out of work, and invested millions in local small businesses, scientific research and transportation projects.
