Rep. Slaughter Leads Renewable
Energy Meeting with Upstate NY Caucus and Sandia National Labs

Washington, DC - Congresswoman Louise M. Slaughter (D-NY-28), Chair of the House Committee on Rules and Chair of the Upstate New York Caucus, today led a meeting between members of the bi-partisan Upstate New York Caucus and officials from Sandia National Laboratories regarding renewable energy development, particularly geothermal energy, in Upstate New York.

"My top priority is to keep Upstate New York strong and growing and the creation of a clean energy economy will do just that," said Congresswoman Slaughter. "I am proud to have brought key players to the table to work towards meeting Upstate New York's future energy needs. I am especially interested in using clean, renewable energy to one day power high-speed rail which is on the fast track for Upstate."

The group met with Douglas Blankenship, the manager of the Geothermal Research Department at Sandia, the department charged with researching the construction of wells in geothermal and other extreme environments. The group discussed whether this form of renewable energy production would be an option for Upstate New York.

Mr. Blankenship also addressed the issues associated with renewable energy production in support of a high-speed rail system. Development of a high-speed rail line between Buffalo and Albany is a preeminent priority for Rep. Slaughter and the Upstate New York Caucus.
