Washington, DC -Congresswoman Slaughter is proud to announce that the House will consider next week transportation legislation which will deliver \$25 million dollars in critical transportation funding to New York's 28th Congressional District.

Just this morning, the House Transportation Committee completed their mark-up on the Transportation Authorization Bill (TEA-LU). An amendment was attached which provides funding for Member projects, including \$25 Million in transportation development projects for New York's 28th District.

A detailed summary of the projects in the 28th District is included below.

This legislation is expected to be considered on the House floor next week, and in her new role as Ranking Member of the House Rules Committee, Congresswoman Slaughter will be managing the floor debate on the rule for this critical legislation.

This legislation is expected to pass both the House and Senate

\$2 Million Enhancement of the Michigan Avenue Corridor, Buffalo

\$1.5 Million Construct and enhance Fillmore Avenue and traffic down-grade and infrastructure improvements to Humboldt Parkway, Buffalo

\$4 Million Roadway, streetscape, pedestrian, transit, and parking improvements to the Buffalo Niagara Medical Campus, Buffalo

ROCHESTER

\$2.4 Million Design/Environmental work on the Inner Loop from Clinton Avenue to East Main Street, Rochester

\$1.5 Million Design and Construction of an enhancement project at the Erie Canal Aqueduct in downtown Rochester

\$900,000 Construct/reconstruct Lincoln Road: Commercial Street to Route 31F in the Town-Village of East Rochester

\$500,000 Brooks Landing Transportation Improvements and Enhancement project, Rochester

\$2 million Reconstruction and improvements of University Avenue and the extension of the ARTWalk project, Rochester

\$1 million Intermodal Center Parking Facility
