"I have always been a strong believer in the value of reading as one of the key foundations of the strength of our community," Rep. Slaughter said. "In a time when literary reading is rapidly declining among all age groups, I feel strongly that programs like the Big Read are enormously important. I am excited that Rochester will be undertaking another one of America's classic novels, and I look forward to hearing about the discussions it will provoke."

The Big Read is the largest reading program in the United States, and helps to encourage Americans across the nation discover the joy of reading great literature. Rochester is among 130 communities selected nationwide to participate in the first phase of the 2008 Big Read program that will take place between January and June 2008. This program provides communities with reader's guides, teacher's guides, website information, and television and radio spots to promote the selected book.

This year, participants will read Ray Bradbury's Fahrenheit 451.
